WESTONBIRT SCHOOL'S TRIP LEAVES LASTING BONDS AND IMPACT

Last month, 13 of our Year 11-13 students returned home inspired after a ten-day expedition across South India, as part of this year's Global Perspectives Trip. Our global service programme includes trips to Nepal, India and very soon, Kenya, for our older students to participate in and contribute to fundraising, development, and community initiatives as well as experience different cultures.

This ten-day excursion included visits to fishing villages, local markets, temples, tea estates, spice plantations, a jungle trail and one of India's 27 tiger reserves, Periyar at Thekaddy. The trip also included a five-day stay at the Goodwill Children's Home in Thandigudi. The students took with them nearly 400kg of donations for the children, having been inundated with donations of books, toys, stationery, clothing, and knitted hats from the Westonbirt School community. During the five days, a strong bond was made between the young children at the Home and our students – it was tough for both sides to say goodbye.

Scarlett, a Year 13 student and part of the Student Council, said:

'The trip to India was an incredible experience to be a part of. We gained a cultural understanding of a country so different to our own, and we were able to do this by visiting incredible buildings and other places. Although this trip was to benefit the children at Goodwill, the visit taught us an endless amount as well. Being part of a partnership through the school is an incredible opportunity and I hope it is something that Westonbirt continues for years to come.'

The students have come back from this global service trip with so many things – new life experiences, an appreciation of another culture, and a better understanding of some of the challenges faced by the children at Goodwill. They've also returned with a renewed determination to keep fundraising for this exceptional institution.

A RAY OF HOPE: Magudeswarn sees the world with one restored eye, hopes for the same miracle for the other

Magudeswarn's journey began in a humble hut in Boothamalai village in 2014, born to parents facing the harsh realities of poverty and illiteracy. With an elder sister attending class 6 at the Government School in Kuppammalpatti, Magudeswarn, now in class 3 at Korancombu School, is pursuing his education through the support of the Goodwill Tribal Outreach Programmme (TORP).

At the tender age of three, Magudeswarn's life took an unforeseen turn when he contracted measles, leading to a rapid decline in his eyesight. Unfortunately, his parents, unaware of the severity of the situation, did not seek medical intervention until he was enrolled in a government boarding school at the age of six.

The TORP staff and Dr Rajkumar's team, upon discovering the gravity of Magudeswarn's condition, urged his parents to consider surgery to restore his eyesight. Despite initial hesitation, Magudeswarn's parents opted for traditional remedies, delaying the inevitable solution. After three years of persistent persuasion, they finally agreed to the surgery. The right eye operation, supported by Goodwill TORP, took place on 16 June at the Aravind Eye Hospital in Madurai. However, the left eye still awaits the necessary intervention. Magudeswarn's family, grappling



with day-to-day expenses, faces financial hardships. His father, the sole breadwinner as a daily wage worker, and a non-working mother are now seeking medical assistance from Goodwill-TORP. Witnessing a young child endure such suffering is heart-wrenching, but thanks to organisations like Goodwill, Dr Rajkumar, and the Aravind Eye Hospital, Magudeswarn has regained eyesight in his right eye. Now, the family seeks help from Goodwill to facilitate the much-needed surgery for his left eye.

VISIONARY WORKSHOP FOR SUSTAINABLE IMPACT

In a significant initiative, the India staff of Goodwill convened a workshop on November 6th with the aim of delving into the essence of Goodwill. Titled "Who We Are?" the workshop proved to be an enlightening experience.

On this occasion, they brought together senior staff members from the children's homes and TORP to collaboratively shape the vision, mission, and values of the organisation. UK Chairman, Dr David Neill and trustee, Mr Richard Fenwick, on one front, contributed their insights into visualising the trajectory of Goodwill over the next 5 years. Simultaneously, they sought to comprehend the perspective of the field staff, those tirelessly working at the grassroots level, on where they envision Goodwill in 5 years.

Key questions about their identity and purpose were explored, making the exercise more profound

and participatory. To enhance the depth of their exploration, they opted for a pictorial method, inviting staff to express their sentiments visually and predict the future of Goodwill at the end of 5 years.

The team was divided into three groups, each equipped with a white chart paper and a selection of magazines containing relevant images. The task assigned to each team was to formulate a theme and creatively arrange the photos to illustrate their vision of where Goodwill would stand five years from now. This hands-on approach fostered a dynamic and engaging atmosphere, encouraging active participation and thoughtful contributions from every member.

In the picturesque village of Boothamalai, nestled among the many communities touched by TORP's compassionate initiatives, one family's story stands out — the resilient Lakshmi family. Headed by Ms Lakshmi, they face the daunting challenge of Muscular Dystrophy, a relentless condition with no cure. However, with the unwavering support of Goodwill TORP, their lives have seen a remarkable transformation.

Five members of the Lakshmi family navigate the complexities of Muscular Dystrophy, a condition that necessitates ongoing medical attention. Dr Rajkumar Ramasamy, a dedicated referral doctor affiliated with TORP, leads the charge in providing both medical treatment and emotional counselling to the family. Goodwill TORP extends crucial financial support every month, ensuring access to necessary medication and a balanced, high-fibre diet.

The impact of Goodwill's support reverberates beyond mere sustenance. Recognising the family's inability to work due to their health conditions, Goodwill steps in to prevent malnutrition deficiencies, a key concern for those with Muscular Dystrophy. Malnutrition, if left unaddressed, can lead to severe health complications, including obesity, heart disease, and diabetes. While there is no cure for Muscular Dystrophy, Goodwill TORP's commitment lies in enhancing the quality of life for affected families. Through our Tribal Outreach Programme, Goodwill TORP provides essential food staples such as pulses, wheat, eggs, and vegetables, ensuring a more nutritious diet for the Lakshmi family and others like them.

Dr Rajkumar emphasizes the importance of a holistic approach, urging regular medical examinations and adherence to prescribed medication not only for the Lakshmi family but also for the next generation. Goodwill TORP's dedicated staff monitors the family closely,

facilitating the monthly purchase of nutritious food items.

In the face of Muscular Dystrophy's challenges, the Lakshmi family exemplifies resilience and hope, and Goodwill TORP stands as a beacon of support, illuminating their path towards a brighter, healthier future.



Empowering Education Through Teaching Aids and Science Equipment

Goodwill TORP has been instrumental in enhancing the quality of education for underprivileged children in government schools by providing essential teaching aids and science equipment. With an unwavering commitment, TORP continually equips students with the necessary tools to facilitate content comprehension, coordinate activities, and foster innovative learning approaches.



The teaching aids offered serve as valuable resources for revision, activity coordination, and engaging learning experiences. In addition, the provision of science materials supports students in their pursuit of scientific knowledge.

TORP's benevolent efforts have reached a total of 656 students across 12 government schools, comprising 433 male students and 223 female students. This impactful initiative spans various schools, including K.C Patti Primary School, K.C Patti High School, KoranKombu Govt Boarding School, and others.

The positive influence of TORP's project is evident in the individual statistics for each school, where a combined total of 400 male and 200 female students have directly benefited. This project stands as a beacon of hope, making a significant difference in the educational journey of these students. The numbers speak volumes, showcasing the profound impact TORP has had on over 600 young minds in government schools.
